Gearing Up For The 2020 Conference

The 2020 Annual Conference will be held on September 16-18, 2020 at the Old National Events Plaza.

Abstract Submittals

The INAFSM Conference Committee will begin accepting abstracts for the 2020 Conference on January I, 2020. Abstract submission forms may be found on the INAFSM website at that time. Sessions are 50 minutes in length and include 10 minutes for Q & A.

All abstract submissions should be received by April 1, 2020. Sessions and speakers that have been selected will be notified in May.

Awards Submittals

Its never too early to begin thinking about those in the organization that are deserving of an award. The call for nominations will be coming out soon. Award categories include: Excellence Stormwater Management, Outstanding Stormwater Project, Excellence in Floodplain Management, Outstanding Floodplain Project, Excellent Strides in Floodplain Management, and Outreach-Education.

Indiana Floodplain Information Portal

The Indiana Department of Natural Resources Division of Water is the State Coordinating Office for the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) in Indiana. In this capacity, we want to provide and keep the information as up-to-date as possible for Indiana communities participating in the NFIP.

One resource that is available to your community is the Indiana Floodplain Information Portal (INFIP), infip.dnr.IN.gov. INFIP is a mapping application that provides floodplain information for waterways to help citizens determine flood risk in an effort to minimize flood damage. INFIP uses FEMA-published floodplain data and floodplain data from various DNR-approved resources in order to provide the most available, comprehensive coverage of floodplain information for the State of Indiana.

The main functions of INFIP enable you to: select a point of interest (i.e., residence or tract of land) to view floodplain mapping and the Base Flood Elevations (BFE); print a floodplain map for a point of interest; submit a request for a Floodplain Analysis/Regulatory Assessment (FARA) from the Division of Water using the (electronic Floodplain Analysis/ Regulatory Assessment) Wizard; view general information and answers to frequently asked questions (FAQ) concerning floodplains, flood risk, flood insurance, and state floodway construction permitting; obtain contact information for your local floodplain agency; and link to FEMA flood insurance studies. Currently, INFIP defaults to the "Best Available" Floodplain Layer.

The best available floodplain layer dataset is presented as a statewide GIS data layer and can be viewed on a number of platforms and portals, including INFIP listed above. Data can be downloaded (by county) by individuals who want to work with the data locally and is available as a Representational State Transfer (REST) service from the division's website. This dataset is a companion to FEMA's National Flood Hazard Layer (NFHL), which is a digital representation of the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs). In addition to INFIP, a story map is available at https://arcg.is/1e1P8j. It provides the ability to see the comparison of FEMA's National Flood Hazard Layer and the DNR "best available" floodplain layer.

Recently we have found that some communities exercise their rights and enforce an extraterritorial jurisdictional area to either their flood hazard ordinance, zoning ordinance, or both. This has led to some of these communities not receiving the appropriate correspondence or other notices from our office when changes occur in these areas. Another issue in these areas is that incorrect floodplain administrator contact information is displayed when someone selects a site located in this buffer area (extraterritorial jurisdictional area).

In an effort to correct this issue and provide communities and the public with the most correct and up-to-date information, the DNR is requesting either a GIS data layer or a map where the department can build a map layer to reflect the areas or buffers for all of the affected communities. Once this layer is complete, it will ensure the appropriate communities are notified of permits, FARAs, and other actions. It will also display the appropriate contact information for the floodplain administrator for all areas.

In an effort to correct this issue and provide communities and the public with the most correct and up-to-date information, the DNR is requesting either a GIS data layer or a map where the department can build a map layer to reflect the areas or buffers for all of the affected communities.
